Owners

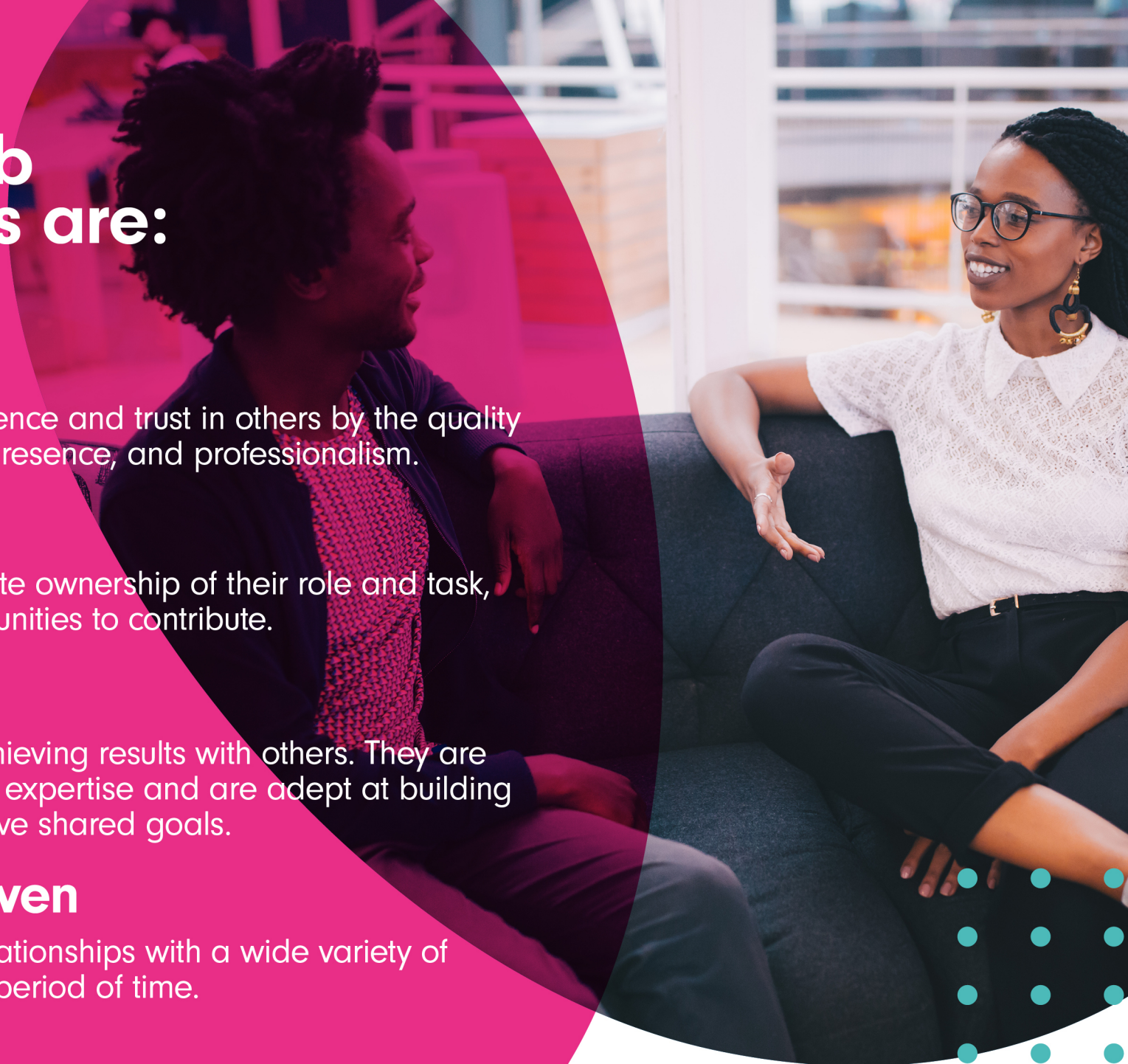
Ambassadors take complete ownership of their role and task, always seeking out opportunities to contribute.

The Ambassador Alumni Network - How can former apprentices and graduates get involved?

Your apprenticeship or graduate scheme is over, what happens next?

If you've already completed your apprenticeship or graduate scheme (or if you're coming to the end and thinking about the future), you can still be part of the network as an Ambassador Alumni.

This means that you can still get involved in all the activities and have your story on the site, but also gives you the opportunity to support other ambassadors on the network. Especially when it comes to the end of their apprenticeship or graduate scheme and they need some guidance on the transition into their next role.

What's in it for employers and training providers?

- Encourage prospective candidates to ask questions on LinkedIn to facilitate networking, best practise and top tips
- Input towards our communications via social media channels to support key messages and campaigns (e.g. National Apprenticeship Week).
- Get unbiased feedback from current apprentices or graduates to help us deliver you a better service.
- Additional PR opportunities through our network and exposure alongside FTSE250 companies
- Have access to GetMyFirstJob recorded content for use in own promotional material.
- Ambassadors will also naturally be advocates for their employer and training provider, spotlighting their experience and encouraging future applicants.
- Ambassadors will be exposed to experiences and areas they may not gain through their apprenticeship or graduate scheme alone, such as networking and mentoring which will help them in their end-point assessment.





Who can join and how?
